### Equivalents and Course Equivalent Request (CER)

Each course you take abroad must be assigned a UW-Madison “equivalent” and the grade you receive in the course also transfers back to be recorded on your UW-Madison transcript.

For Hindi language courses, you will receive credits for the next course(s) in the UW-Madison Hindi language sequence.

### Limits and Load

This program has a set curriculum.

### Credits

IAP has established guidelines for translating credits from CET to UW-Madison. In general, credits are translated on a 1:1 basis from CET programs. Therefore, a 3-credit course from CET will have a 3-credit UW-Madison equivalent. There may be exceptions to this rule.

Your courses will be sent to IAP on a CET grade report. IAP will process these courses to a UW-Madison transcript with credit, grades and the course equivalents as listed above.

### Grades and Grade Conversions

The grading conversion scale is the following:
