International Academic Programs, in conjunction with other University of Wisconsin-Madison administrators, are closely monitoring numerous sources about the Ebola virus outbreak, including the [CDC Travel Health Notices](#) and the [U.S. Department of State Travel Warnings](#).

University Health Service (UHS) is maintaining a [website](#) with the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) travel warnings, alerts, and advice. Guinea, Liberia, and Sierra Leone currently are currently subject to a [travel warning](#) against nonessential travel. A [travel alert](#) has been issued for travelers to the Democratic Republic of the Congo. International Academic Programs currently does not have any students in any of the most affected countries in West Africa—Guinea, Liberia, Sierra Leone, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

Currently, all International Academic Program study abroad programs continue to operate normally. International Academic Programs will continue to closely monitor the Ebola outbreak and assess its impact on our students, faculty, and staff on our study abroad programs.
